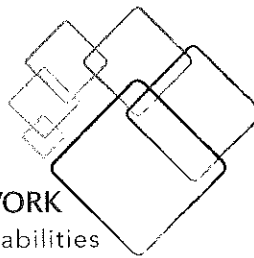



The NDRN is a willing partner and eager to work with NACDD if funding is awarded. NDRN is the membership organization of the 57 P&A programs throughout the country. NDRN also provides training and technical assistance to the P&As and will be able to coordinate activities under this project with all of the P&A agency. In 2008, NDRN has represented 3764 of Hispanics which represents about 16% of our DD clients through its individual and systemic advocacy.

NACDD has asked NDRN to partner by using our networks to disseminate information to its stakeholders about the project and its events. To support the costs of these efforts, we agree to provide these services for \$5,000 for the duration of this grant.
